








Americans and the 2017 Eclipse, Jon Miller (U. Michigan):

- The response was overwhelmingly positive.





RTF: "I didn't know you were interested in astronomy."


RJL: "I'm not."

For the public, a total solar eclipse...

...is <u>not</u> necessarily about astronomy!





**Don't** say, "A total solar eclipse is a rare event."



<u>Do</u> say, "It is rare for a total solar eclipse to occur in the place where you live."





**Don't** say, "A total solar eclipse is a once-in-a-lifetime experience!"



<u>Do</u> say, "You need to see a total solar eclipse at least once in your lifetime!"





**Don't** say, "Never look at the Sun without eye protection!"



<u>Do</u> say, "Except during totality, never look at the Sun without eye protection!"



Don't say, "Outside the path, you'll have a partial solar eclipse. Inside the path you'll have a total solar eclipse."



Do say, "Outside the path, you'll have only a partial eclipse. Inside the path, you'll have a total eclipse with partial phases on either side."


