

Get Ready for the Solar Eclipse of April 8th!



On Monday, April 8, 2024, a solar eclipse will be visible across most of North America. In a narrow path that runs through northernmost New Hampshire and Vermont, the Moon will completely block the Sun's bright face, providing a rare opportunity to experience a *total* solar eclipse without having to travel far.

How and why do eclipses happen? What's the difference between a total solar eclipse and a partial one? What, exactly, will we see on April 8th in New Hampshire and Vermont, and when? How can we observe the Sun safely?
